### Arla Visit

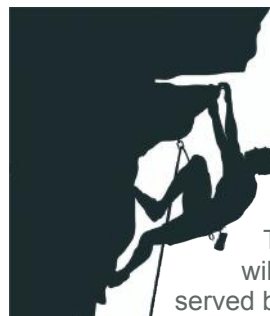
Arla will be visiting the Sixth Form on Friday to discuss Engineering Apprenticeships for those interested in Year 13.
