Using Social Media Sensibly

A reminder that pupils should not post materials on social media that could harm reputations or upset other people. This includes negative comments that can be seen as homophobic or discriminatory to those with a disability or specific learning needs. It is clear in our school policies that it is not acceptable for pupils to take images from the school website or social media sites and use these to cause harm to others.

Please support us to educate and support your child to consider what they post as the school takes these issues very seriously. Our rule of thumb for pupils is that if they would not want their comment, video or image they have created printed on the side of a bus, with their name, then they probably should not post it.

Page 13 of our ICT policy states:

I know that anything I share online, store digitally or use on a digital device may be monitored.

I know that once I share anything online it is completely out of my control and may be used by others in a way that I did not intend.

I am aware of the CEOP report button and know when to use it.

I agree that I will not:

- visit internet sites, make, post, download, upload or pass on, material, remarks, proposals or comments that contain or relate to:

- inappropriate images
- promoting discrimination of any kind
- promoting violence or bullying
- promoting racial or religious hatred
- promoting illegal acts
