

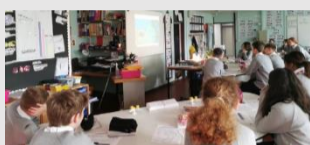
### Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week, the students enjoyed lots of COP 26 related lessons as well as experiencing a Climate Solutions Careers Fair, exposing the students to some future careers in industries working on future technologies. Feedback from our visitors was strong – “**Students were really engaged and eager to learn – your values were reflected in the quality of the event and engagement of the students was very apparent.**” “**Your students were awesome**”.

In Science, the students were modelling the effects of climate change, whilst in Digital Communications students have debated climate change as well as learning about the laws around eWaste and considered the alternatives to buying a new phone.

Our own COP 26 UN Summit produced some interesting outcomes, probably going further than the COP 26 Summit in Glasgow when they conclude. The students involved gained a lot from the experience. Brazil promised China \$10bn to help replant 15 million trees to help offset their increased carbon emissions, China pledged to reduce their carbon emission to 5 tonnes per capita by 2050 (UK is about 10 tonnes per capita presently) and asks other countries to join this pledge. Japan and Chile have promised to invest into China’s renewable energy sector whilst Chile is promising to close 100% of all their coal mines by 2030 - China, Brazil, Germany, India and Panama agreed to this as well!

Global co-operation was secured with a \$50bn investment into India to ensure they can move quickly towards renewables, as well as clean up water supplies in the country.
