GCSE MATHS REVISION

Maths papers are set on a weekly basis to all year 11 groups alongside hegarty maths to support the understanding of any questions within those papers.
- You can come and see a Maths teacher during an after school slot on a Wednesday and/or Friday.

- CGP revision guides and workbooks can be purchased from students services for £2.85 each.
- The updated list of topics for the summer exams will be provided following the current set of mocks, giving the up to date topic lists and hegarty clip numbers to further support revision.
- Each Maths teacher has produced a 10 week plan for the remainder of our time from Easter which is based on the needs of their Maths group, using information from topics found challenging during the mocks or any in class assessments.
- Every student has also had a complete personalised learning checklist, allowing them to view what topics they personally need to work on from the first set of mocks, they will then receive another one of these following the second set of mocks.
