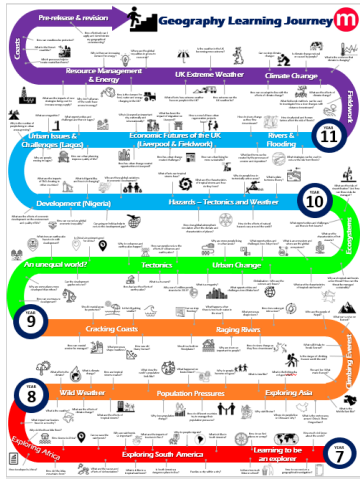
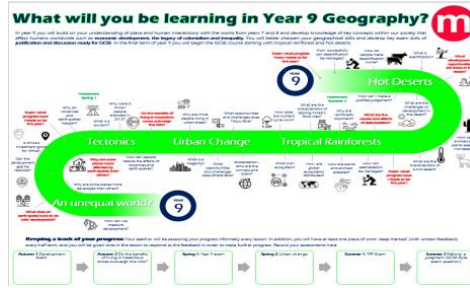


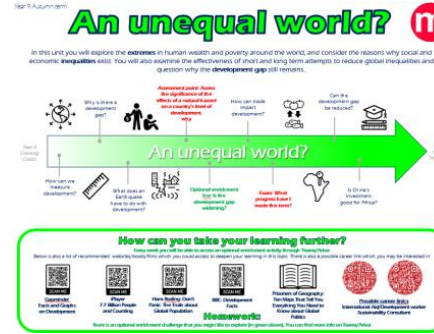
Learning journeys – in every subject. These tell you what is learnt through the whole course. They are on the website and on walls in classes.

The parent bulletin and website gives you information about upcoming events and what is going on in the school, also follow our Facebook page @MarchesSchool for further supplementary communication.

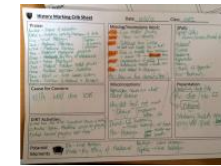


Parents' Evening is the chance to talk to each teacher to discuss how things are going. All year groups have one a year. Year 7, 11, 12 and 13 have two a year.

An **Attainment Report** is shared at the start of the spring and summer term in Key Stage 4 and for all years at the end of the year. To support Options, Year 9 also get this at the start of spring term. You can see how close we believe your child is to achieving or exceeding their minimum expected grades at GCSE.
