


Is my child well enough to go to school?

Knowing that a child is too poorly to stay off school can be a tough decision. It often comes down to whether the child can still participate in lessons. Having a sore throat, cough, or mild congestion does not always mean they cannot participate, but it may mean we have to make an adjustment to their day.

Children can come to school with medication such as paracetamol, but this must be handed into Reception on arrival along with instructions on dosage and the completion of consent form.

If in doubt, please phone the absence line and let school know you have decided to send your child to school but that you are concerned that they are unwell. We will then know if they need to be sent home if they report to the medical room. We will always send a child home if a parent has contacted us to say they have insisted their child at least tries school.
