
## French

### Intent:

Produce engaged linguists for the future who are equipped with linguistical skills and cultural appreciation. Our curriculum will drive progress in terms of communication, independence, problem solving, memory skills and critical thinking. Students will study topics relevant to their lives.

### Context:

Students continue to develop their linguistical skills from KS3 and KS4 and expand their tolerance and respect from other cultures. The MFL curriculum has a strong emphasis on promoting cultural values allowing students to be open to socio-cultural difference around them.



The Big Picture—Intent: Developing analytical skills to discuss the political, social and regional aspects of the Francophone world.

The intent of this A level course is for students to develop confident linguistical skills in describing their world and issues that affect the Francophone world. In doing so, they will be able to develop a wide range of vocabulary and grammatical structures in a variety of tenses and moods, in order to carefully analyse different aspects of modern society. Students learn about the social, political and cultural aspects of the Francophone world, using a wide range of lexis to analyse these elements in daily life.. In grammatical terms, students will be able to confidently articulate themselves using a wide range of tenses, moods and idiomatic phrases in order to confidently communicate in the TL.
