## Preparation information for Year 10 exams

Subject: Art - Fine Art and 3D Art

**Producing a Creative Personal Outcome** - Your **personal outcome** is your opportunity to create a meaningful and unique artwork that ties into your portfolio coursework. This **exam is only 5 hours** long, but you will have **double this time in the summer exam next year**, so **focus on quality over quantity**—you are not expected to finish the entire piece.

What is Visual Language: Line, shape, and texture to add structure and detail, colour and contrast to create mood and emphasis, composition and balance to guide the viewer's eye, symbolism and meaning to make the piece more personal.

What Should You Prepare?: Your Portfolio Theme: Ensure your piece connects with the overall theme you've been working on, artist Research: Create strong links with the artists who inspire your project and consider their techniques.

- 1. **Techniques & Materials:** Decide which artistic methods suit your personal response.
- 2. Composition & Layout: Plan how to structure your piece for maximum visual impact.
- 3. **Annotations & Reflection:** Be able to explain the meaning behind your artistic choices.

What tasks should you complete prior to the exam day?

- Mind Map Ideas: Sketch and brainstorm imagery that fits your theme.
- Artist Studies: Practice techniques inspired by artists relevant to your project.
- Sketchbook Refinement: Experiment with compositions, textures, and colour schemes.
- Mock-Up or Mini Version: Create a small-scale test piece to visualize your final work.
- Written Reflections: Explain your choices and how your work connects to your portfolio.

What can you bring to the exam?

You will be given one exam paper for English Language which will be to write a story.

You will have 45 minutes to do this.

There will be a choice of 4 questions/tasks/titles. You will need to choose **ONE** of these.

Make sure that you write at least 2 pages; any less will mean to will be capping yourself at a Band 2.

The word count is between 450 and 600 words. Know what this looks like in your handwriting, or typing if you are using a laptop.



You will have ONE question to complete for English Language (a story) and ONE question to complete for English Literature (An Inspector Calls).

Subject: English Literature (EDUQAS)

What topics should be revised? An Inspector Calls

- 1) Revise the **CONTEXT** of the play as you can refer to this if and when it is relevant in your essay (who wrote it, when, why, when was it set etc...)
- 2) Revise at least **5 quotations** for each of these 3 characters: **Mr. Birling, Mrs. Birling, and Sheila.** (Your exam will be on ONE of these characters.)
- 3) How do these characters behave at the start of the play?
- 4) How do they develop?
- 5) Learn key terms and spellings, such as: **DRAMATIC IRONY, FORESHADOWING, SOCIAL CLASSES, PRIESTLEY, CHARACTER, CAPITALISM, SOCIALISM**

What task should pupils do to complete the revision?

Students should use their literature books to help them revise.

Re-read the play (you all have a copy of it) and rewatch the film version.

You should also use revision sites such as BBC Bitesize and GCSE Pod to revise An Inspector Calls

**Living World (Pg 20-32):** Desertification, Desert fringe environments, Deforestation. Case studies e.g. Western Desert, Sahel, Amazon Rainforest

Tectonics (Pg 3-8): 3 types of plate boundaries, management of tectonic hazards, Nepal 2015 and L'Aquila 2009- key facts, effects and responses.

Development (Pg 77 - 83): Measures of development and pros and cons, causes of the development gap

The Challenge of Resource Management (Pg 90-93, 106-110): UK demand for food, Energy source exploitation - pros and cons, Energy sustainability.

What task should pupils do to complete the revision?

All pages above refer to the green CGP textbook. Please do also use other revision guides for support. Mrs Catmur-Oxtoby has a range you can view before purchasing online if this helps.

Online revision materials that may help include SENECA and GCSE Pod.

Create self-quizzing sheets to test key information, alongside using mind maps and flashcards. We also encourage using knowledge splats to identify strengths and gaps in knowledge.

Any other relevant information for pupils:

The exam will cover content taught at the end of Year 9 and so far in Geography - please speak to your teacher if you need additional support with Living World topics.

Subject: Media

What topics should be revised?

You need to be able to discuss these elements of analysing media products:

- Media Language (Section A) how a product looks on the page/screen.
- Representations (Section A) how representations in products influence audiences. You will be asked to compare a set text to an unseen text.
- Industries (Section B) how the industry behind a product influences your set text.
- Audiences (Section B) how are audiences targeted/influenced by your set texts.

You will need to revise the below industries and set texts for your exams:

- Advertising (This Girl Can, Quality Street)
- Film (No Time to Die, The Man with the Golden Gun)
- Magazines (GQ and Vogue)
- Video Games (Fortnite covered before your exam)

What task should pupils do to complete the revision?

Pupils will be given revision booklets to revise from. Pupils should use these to create flashcards/mind maps. Pupils can also use the 'Mrs Fisher' videos on YouTube to aid revision.

Any other relevant information for pupils:

Not all of the Component 1 topics will come up on the exam, but you will need to revise them all to ensure you have covered all bases.

Refining Your Colour Project

Your **colour project** is a chance to develop your ideas and experiment with **digital editing and physical collage**. Use this studio time to explore techniques, rather than rushing to complete a final piece—**quality over quantity**!

## **How to Prepare**

- 1. **Colour Theory:** How colour choices affect mood and meaning.
- 2. **Artist Research:** Find photographers who use colour creatively.
- 3. **Composition & Lighting:** How arrangement and light improve an image.
- 4. **Editing Skills:** Use **Photoshop & Lightroom** to refine contrast, saturation, overlays, etc.
- 5. **Collage & Mixed Media:** Layer, cut, and combine materials creatively.

### Tasks to complete

✓ Mood Board: Collect colours, textures, and inspirations. ✓ Photography Experiments: Test different lighting, angles, and compositions. ✓ Digital Editing: Practice colour adjustments, blending modes, and retouching. ✓ Collage & Layering: Combine printed images with physical materials. ✓ Presentation Prep: Decide on layouts, print styles, and display formats.

## What to bring to studio time

✓ Your PowerPoint presentation with ideas and research. ✓ Photos (unedited, raw images, or initial drafts). ✓ Materials for collage and mixed media experiments.

Tip: Speak with your photography teacher before your session to check guidelines.

**Final Advice, Use your time wisely**—plan each stage carefully, **experiment freely**—try new editing techniques and layouts, **presentation matters**—think about how your work is displayed, make it **personal**—show your style and creativity!
