Great Depression	A period of serious economic crisis in the 1930s

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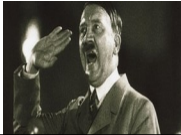

<u>Terror</u> SS – Police force who ran the Police State – wore black shirts. Gestapo – secret police who spy. Concentration Camps – people sent here to do manual labour.	<u>Women</u> Women were expected to be traditional. Their main role was to be a housewife and provide children. Hitler rewarded women with medals and money for	<u>Worker</u> Banned trade unions – so workers had little rights. Created work programs to lower unemployment. Encouraged work through rewards -	<u>Children</u> Joined youth groups that encouraged Nazism Boys – Hitler Youth – learnt to be a soldier and good soldiers. Girls – League of German Maidens – taught to be a housewife
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
