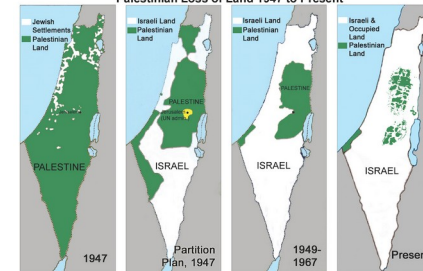
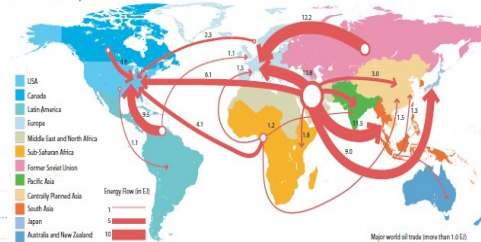
Region	A specific area which shares common characteristics e.g physical features, climate or cultural aspects
Transcontinental	Spans across or connects to multiple continents
Climate	Long-term weather patterns and conditions of a particular region, e.g temperature, precipitation, wind patterns
Arid	A climate or environment that is extremely dry, with little rainfall and limited vegetation
Crude Oil	Crude oil is a naturally occurring, unrefined petroleum product that is extracted from the Earth and used as a source of energy
Ethnic Groups	Community who share a common cultural background or descent.
Human Rights	The basic rights and freedoms, regardless of nationality, race, gender or other characteristics
Globalisation	The way the world has become interconnected through trade, international investment and sharing ideas
Megacity	A city with more than 10 million inhabitants
Sustainability	Meeting the demands of the present without compromising the needs of the future

The Middle East features a variety of dramatic landforms, including the Zagros Mountains, the Arabian Desert, the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers and the Dead Sea. It has 17 different countries spanning across 3 main biomes: Desert, Savannah land and

Deserts		Vast areas of the Middle East and Central Asia are hot, dry deserts. Some of the largest deserts are the Arabian Desert, the Syrian Desert and the Negev Desert. The Sahara Desert extends into
Animals		Egypt. The Middle East is home to a diverse array of animal species, many of which are well-adapted to the region's harsh desert climate. E.g Arabian Oryx, camels, the Arabian Leopard and the Nubian Ibex.
Rivers		The Middle East is home to several major rivers, Tigris and Euphrates in Iraq, the Nile in Egypt, the Jordan River in Israel/Jordan, and the Karun River in Iran.

The Middle East has a long history of conflict, which has prevented some countries from developing. However, through their wealth of natural resources, some countries have been able to develop into leader global players. However, there are concerns about human rights and corruption within Middle Eastern Countries, especially Qatar which hosted the 2022 Fifa World Cup.
